ORDER

The Syndicate while considering the eligibilty criteria of the Double Main Programmes vide paper read as (1) above, resolved to direct the sections concerned to do the needful to convene urgent meeting of the Board of Studies in respect of the Subjects concerned, for framing the formula to calculate index mark of Double Main UG Programmes for admission to PG Programmes, and, to entrust the Vice Chancellor to take appropriate action on the recommendation of the Board of Studies.

Accordingly meetings of respective Boards of Studies were convened and recommended the eligibility criteria and calculation of index marks of Double Main Programmes for admission to PG Programmes.

Subsequent of the above, a meeting of the Chairpersons of the Board of Studies in Commerce(PG), Computer Science(PG), English(PG), Economics(PG), Geology (PG), Geography, Journalism, Malayalam(PG) and Mathematics(PG) convened with the Director, IQAC for finalizing the calculation of index marks of Double Main Programmes for admission to PG Programmes recommended, vide paper read as (2) above, the eligibility and ranking criteria of the Double main programmes for admission to PG programmes as follows :

PG Programmes in Malayalam	Graduation in double main programme with Malayalam as one of the Core Courses securing not less than 4.5 CCPA(S) * out of 10 Course: BA English and Malayalam Literature.	In ranking, conversion for ranking shall be done based on the existing norms/procedure considering the Core Course Malayalam.
PG Programme in Journalism	Graduation in double main programme(10+2+3) of this University or other Indian/Foreign University recognised by the University of Kerala as equivalent thereto and have secured a minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade in Part III/core graduate course are eligible to apply. However, candidates belonging to other socially and economically backward communities are eligible for relaxation of 5% marks in the qualifying examination and those belonging to scheduled caste/scheduled tribe having secured a pass in the qualifying degree examination are eligible to apply for admission to the programme. Course: BA English and Media Studies/ BA Economics and Media Studies	The candidates will be ranked on the basis of the CGPA(S)/CCPA(S) obtained and the same will be converted into marks for the purpose of indexing/ ranking. A weightage of 10 marks will be given (after conversion for ranking) to those who have studied the subjects concerned as Core Course and those who have studied the subject as complimentary course.
PG Programmes in Economics	Graduation in double main programme with Economics as one of the Core Courses with not less than 4.5 CCPA(S)* out of 10. CCPA secured for Core Course [Economics] converted to percentage (by the formula provided by respective Universities) will be added to CCPA(S)* converted to percentage as weightage. Courses: BA Economics and Media Studies/BA Economics and Mathematics	Marks secured for Economics Main/ Core Course is to be taken as weightage and added to total marks secured.
PG Programmes in Mathematics	Graduation in double main programme with Mathematics as one of the Core courses securing not less than 5.5	The candidates will be ranked on the basis of the CCPA(S) plus the CCPA of the core
