Introduction

As we all know, Islamic history is an important source for learning about a civilization. Today, more than ever, the challenges of globalisation compel Islamic historians and researchers to expand their knowledge beyond local, national, and even continental borders. However, in order to compete and keep up with the ever-expanding horizon of Islamic history, one must be sensitive in understanding the issues of Islam and its history on a larger canvas, absorbing polemics, and not simply creating a belief of continuity by exploring the past, which is abundant. This will almost certainly increase the dialogue between the past and the present, and a new narrative may emerge.

At the outset, it should be stated that the origin of this draught document is to meet the fundamental challenges of ever changing academic scales at the global level. Thus, fostering quality higher education is a high priority task in the context of India's future education development agenda. The idea is to involve young minds in knowledge production and to increase knowledge participation. Participation in knowledge by young minds represents a significant departure from the existing undergraduate structure. The new structure's implementation is based on the guiding principles of LOCF. To clarify the situation, a prudent section of the Learning Outcomes-Based Curriculum Framework (LoCF) for undergraduate education must be quoted. The fundamental premise underlying the learning outcome based approach to curriculum planning and development is that higher education qualifications such as Bachelor's Degree Programme are awarded on the basis of demonstrated achievement of outcomes (expressed in terms of knowledge, understanding, skills, attitudes, and values) and academic standards expected of programme graduates.

Empiricism suggests that simply reproducing knowledge in a classroom has lost relevance in the face of rapidly changing global demands. A graduate student's mind cannot be treated as an empty vessel. Instead of still using corny, the object in the classroom should be encouraged to participate in the exchange of ideas that leads to the development of cognitive functioning. To reiterate, the curriculum under LOCF is designed with this assumption in mind, as justice to the glorious past and vast canvas of Islamic History can only be done by providing the much needed space at the micro and macro levels. Islamic Historical facts are not stagnant because archaeology, genetics, climate sciences, and other disciplines are constantly making new discoveries. Existing hypotheses, like all fields of knowledge, must be tested. This interaction should be the focus of a pro-active classroom, which can outcome in a researcher with an inquisitive and scientific temperament.

Apart from removing major distortions and misinterpretations, it will have two significant advantages. For starters, it will make Islamic history more about exploration and discovery rather than memorising a fixed narrative. Second, it will provide learners with a sense of ownership over the discipline as well as a broader worldview. For this purpose, static classrooms must be replaced with more interactive ones. Spirit of the draft LOCF is focused on this issue, as it states clearly" a sense of inquiry and capability for asking relevant/appropriate questions, problematizing, synthesizing and articulating; ability to recognize cause and effect relationships, define problems, formulate hypotheses, test hypotheses, analyze interpret and draw conclusions from data, establish hypotheses, predict cause and effect relationship: ability to plan execute and report the results of an experiment or investigation". It is true that Islamic History, as an ethical member of the social science disciplines, serves a social purpose by disseminating scientific and critical understanding of the past through methodologies and theoretical insights that make the subject most relevant to any society in their present. There is nothing called knowing the past for the sake of knowing the past.

Learning Outcome based Curriculum Framework

The goal of this programme is to provide students with a fresh perspective on all Undergraduate courses in Islamic History. It establishes a Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) for all Undergraduate programmes in Islamic History, which will be adopted by various universities. The LOCF approach is intended to provide an undergraduate-level focused, outcome-based syllabus with an agenda to structure teachinglearning experiences in a more student-centric manner. The LOCF approach has been used to enhance students' experiences as they participate in the programme of their choice. The Under-Graduate Programme will prepare students for academic work as well as for future employment.

This course is intended to break down stereotypes about Islamic History learning and to satisfy students' interest in studying Islamic History. This programme is designed to give students the most flexibility possible. There are Core Disciplinary papers that provide fundamental knowledge in Islamic history and the study of the History of Indian Muslims and the Islamic civilization of World. Otherwise, the programme is designed to give students a lot of options so they can tailor their education to their interests. These not only provide knowledge and skills in Islamic history and contemporary history, but also a necessary skill in other disciplines.

Nature and extent of the Programme

The B.A. Islamic History Program is three years long. Every academic year is divided into two semesters. The total number of semesters is six, and each semester is expected to last sixteen weeks. The B.A. Islamic History Programme will include theory classes (lectures) and tutorial classes for teaching and learning.

The curriculum will be taught through formal lectures using power point presentations, audio and video tools, and other teaching aids as needed. Certain courses have additional requirements for documentaries, study tour, field and archival work, museum visits, and project work, which can be met in addition to regular teaching and tutorials.

Graduate Attributes

On completion of the course students are expected to have acquired the skills of critical thinking, rational enquiry, effective communication, and exploring the relationship between the past and the present while remaining sensitive to the larger historiographical debates that is important in the study of human society.

Descriptors of Qualification

Students who successfully complete the course will be awarded a B.A. in Islamic History. This department's B.A. Islamic History graduates are expected to pursue various paths in search of areas of knowledge and professional work that they find fulfilling. They will be able to demonstrate knowledge of major historical works as well as an overview of scholarly debates concerning Islamic history. This will provide a foundation for the student to pursue further studies in Islamic history.

Teaching learning process

The pedagogical methods used include direct lectures, tutorial discussions, and technologyassisted presentations. We believe that education should be interactive, and that all interactions between students and teachers should be based on reciprocity and respect.

1) The lectures (of one hour each) delivered to one whole class at a time systematically deal with the themes of the syllabus. This constitutes the core of the teaching- learning process. The students are provided with bibliographic references and encouraged to go through at least some readings so that they could be more interactive and ask more relevant questions in the class.

2) The class is divided into smaller groups of eight to ten students who interact with the respective teacher once a week for each course. Teaching in tutorial sessions is tailored to the specific needs of individual students, who can ask a variety of questions ranging from what they couldn't understand in class to the practical implications of what the teacher said in lectures or what the students read in a prescribed reading, and so on. Indeed, tutorial discussions are an important and necessary component of the teaching and learning process of the B.A Islamic History programme offered in colleges. This is the location where teachers and students can develop a more relaxed relationship, which helps to create an ideal environment for the free and fearless exchange of ideas and information. Tutorials are also a place where a teacher can monitor the social dynamics among the students and ensure that no one feels marginalised or side-lined in the class because of gender, region, class, or any other reason.

3) Wherever possible, teachers use audio-video-based technology devices (e.g., power point) to enhance the effectiveness of their presentations. Some courses require students to watch a documentary or a feature film, and course themes are designed so that discussions of these films will further nuance students' critical engagement with ideas introduced in their textual materials.

Assessment methods

Graded assessment of all papers is broadly carried out in two forms:

a) There is an end of semester examination (ESE) which covers the entire syllabus.
